June 12 - Pulse Remembrance Day

June 12, 2022, will mark six years since the Pulse nightclub shooting where 49 mostly LGBTQ+ and LatinX people tragically lost their lives. Pulse was considered a refuge for LGBTQ+ Floridians until the tragedy. The club hasn't operated since the shooting, but the site where it stands has turned into a makeshift memorial until a permanent memorial is constructed.



The remembrance of the Pulse nightclub shooting comes as violence against LGBTQ+ people persists. Transgender people, especially black transgender women, face a heightened level of violence. The Human Right Campaign has reported "Sadly, 2022 has already seen at least 14 transgender people fatally shot or killed by other violent means. We say "at least" because too often these stories go unreported — or misreported. In previous years, the majority of these people were Black and Latinx transgender women."

Options with Text-to-Give: From Kip Barkley (kipbarkley@aol.com)

Every church I have ever connected with as a tradition of passing the plate. Typically I put something in, whether I am a member or not.

In these modern times, the River offers a text-to-give option. First, you link your cell phone number to your financial institution. This is all explained online at https://riverofgrassuu.org/donations-and-pledge-info.html.

For example, text 10. plate to 844.948.1153 and your gift is split between LifeNet4Families and our operating fund. Members have reported that they like this split. Alternatively, when you text the 10. with no key word, the full amount goes to our operating fund.

Me, for tax-advantages, I pay my pledge directly out of my IRA. Some members schedule payments. Others pay catch-as-catch-can when they have it. If you text 10. pledge, your payment will go towards your pledge.

What I am partial to is making our new building happen. I typically text 10. cc and this gift will go to the Capital Fund.

Interim Recommendations from the RoG COVID-19 Re-Emergence Team

Purpose of Team: To review guidelines for congregational and smaller group gatherings in order to provide recommendations to the Board to be used for official River of Grass meetings and events.

These recommendations are:

For: only for official, River of Grass - sponsored outdoor and indoor small group gatherings.

Fluid: new information comes out all the time and the recommendations could change.

Inclusive: all attendees should be able to attend physically or virtually.

Protective: consider first those who are most at risk.



Science-based: follow the directives according to the experts.

MEETINGS IN THE TIME OF COVID

RIVER OF GRASS COVID-19 TEAM RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE BOARD: Updated May 24, 2022

This is a living document that will be regularly reviewed and updated.

Based upon the updated CDC guidelines and the Broward County risk levels, the following measures are recommended to the Board.

Community Level High: Follow our previous guidelines, listed below.

In person Worship services - inside

- Masks required for all, with possible exception of speakers (see below). Masks should be KN-95 if possible.
- If the Minister and/or other speakers wish to be unmasked, they must take a rapid test the night before the service. They must maintain social distancing at all times while unmasked.
- Singing transmits more aerosols than speaking. At this time, no singing except the Minister. Humming OK!
- Maintain social distancing between household groups while indoors.
- No food or drinks inside.
- All attendees should sign in with current contact information in the event that contact tracing is required.

After service – outside

- Maintain social distancing.

Meetings and Small Groups - inside and outside.

- Group/meeting leader should determine if all attendees are vaccinated and comfortable with disclosing status. This may require some quick private conversations prior to the meeting! If everyone is not comfortable, masking and social distancing should be maintained.
- Food and drinks: up to the group. Be mindful of crowding.
- All attendees should sign in with current contact information in the event that contact tracing is required.

Community Level Medium: Individuals should follow CDC Guidelines for Medium

Community Level Low: Individuals should follow CDC Guidelines for Low
