Ah, but those pristine erasers, all clean and smooth pink or white. Such a perfect expression of fresh starts. I loved them, and strove to keep them that way even as their pencils ground down and down and down to handy little stubs as the year progressed, clean erasers clear evidence of my academic prowess. All the better to leave my precious Pink Pearl block erasers safely preserved in my pencil box.

But now I know better. For while those unmarked erasers might profess mistakes not made, they may also actually belie ideas never tried. What if clean erasers don't mean accuracy so much as cowardice? What if I never besmirch my eraser not so much for being right but for fear of being wrong? Not for answers always given correctly, but for answers never attempted?

Smudged up erasers mean something entirely different to me now. They mean daring to try new things, test new ideas and challenge old ones. They mean forging ahead to write new stories for our lives. And perhaps more important, the courage to re-write old ones. The clarity to see a mistake. The strength of character to go back and correct it. And the fortitude to sharpen the pencil and try again.



These days, pristine erasers strike me as a little suspicious. I find myself scouting about for the ones that are good and dirtied up, lop-sided and even better all worn down with those triangular replacements affixed over the end of a still perfectly useful pencil. These days the precious pearls are lessons learned.

As we embark on the new congregational year at the River of Grass, we're working on some new ideas. Ideas about who we are, building on who we've been, working toward who we want to be as Unitarian Universalists – in Davie, Florida, in the greater Unitarian Universalist movement afoot in the 21st Century, and in the world that still values clean erasers over those smeared with a lifetime of learning. We've a great year of programming set out before us – workshops, music, youth and adult faith development, sacred celebrations and a new third Sunday evening reflection gathering called "Neshamah," which in Hebrew means "breath."

So let us come and let us write the next chapter of the story of the River of Grass Unitarian Universalist Congregation, freshly sharpened pencils and precious smudged-up erasers in hand!

At first review, all appeared tranquil at River of Grass these last few weeks. The thick, hot air and bright sun of South Florida forced us to take things slower. But looking back, I realize the members of River of Grass were slowly moving mountains. Many traveled far and wide -- many to the annual Southeast Unitarian Universalist Summer Institute (AKA SUUSI). Some painted a house. Some joined the choir. Still others kept the chalice lit at home and took time for relaxation and family. The summer was enjoyable indeed, quiet, yet remarkably active!

There was no board meeting in July. Nevertheless, we coordinated on some issues that couldn't wait until our next meeting. The Service and Social Justice Committee (Judi Oltmans and Steve Jens Rochow, co-chairs) proposed an application for a special endowment from the Live Oak Unitarian Universalist Church of Cedar Park, Texas. Since the deadline for the application was August 1, SSJC, the board convened via email. Live Oak awards grants annually on the basis of their potential to benefit and strengthen the Unitarian Universalist denomination through congregational growth, as well as social and environmental action initiatives. Our SSJC proposes using grant funds as seed money for a benefit concert and dinner at River of Grass to benefit LifeNet4Families. The board unanimously approved via email vote.

The board then took quick action on another request. The Auction Committee co-chairs, Sheryl Cattell and Esther Sampol, requested board support for a casino and game night theme for the upcoming auction on Saturday, March 1st, 2014 to include gambling and playing games for prizes. They requested feedback as they needed to make reservations to secure the date. The board weighed the pros and cons, and in the end, supported this new idea from these dedicated and imaginative volunteers. Be sure to chat with Sheryl and Esther soon to learn more.

The kick-off board meeting for the congregational year was held on Wednesday, August 14th. Here we learned of Rev. Amy's plans and schedule for River of Grass this year. Our board retreat was held on Saturday, August 24. The purpose was to orient new members, re-energize the existing ones, build relationships and set goals for the coming year. I will make available a summary report for those interested.

Here all who are chairpersons or small group leaders meet with our new board vice president, Leana Bresnahan, to coordinate activity and get revved up for this congregational year. MOVE TO AMEND IN BROWARD

In June 2012, River of Grass members voted to support the UUA's stand on the "People's Rights Resolution", a resolution that is working to overturn the U.S. Supreme Court's ruling in Citizens United. Many members of our River of Grass community also wrote letters to their congressional representatives asking them to vote to overturn Citizens United. To further support ongoing efforts, a Broward County Move to Amend (MovetoAmend.org) affiliate has formed.



Move to Amend rejects the U.S. Supreme Court's ruling in Citizens United, and moves to amend our Constitution to firmly establish that money is not speech, and that human beings, not corporations, are persons entitled to constitutional rights. The Broward affiliate's aim at this time is to have the County Commission pass a resolution supporting Move to Amend.


