### **BOING** Rev. Amy Carol Webb

"Resilio" – Latin, "to rebound".

"Spring" – English verb, to rebound to move rapidly from a constrained position; noun, a resilient device, that can return to its former shape when released from tension.

"Boing" – English onomatopoeic, sound made by compressed energy released. As in a spring.

**S**o, yes, it makes a sound. My rebound. And has a bodily sensation, too, like a sudden spiritual G-force as I return to my former shape after trouble or trauma. Boing.

Boing. When I recover from the constrained position of fear.

Boing. When I release the compressed energy of anger.

Boing. When I return to my former shape - which is generally the shape of hopefulness, creativity, resolve.

Boing. When I resurface from the winter of sadness.



Lately I've been taking my lessons in resilience from Earth herself, with the signs of Spring already upon us – the ground orchids that spend the winter looking so much like weeds we have to warn the gardener to leave them be, all at once waving purple and orange good-mornings to the dawn walkers of our neighborhood; the petria creeper whose thick gray stems look altogether dead in January, now throwing cascades of lavender over the fence; the mango that gave almost nothing last year bursting out in thousands of yellow-gold buds that look for the world like the spontaneous laughter of friends feels; the baby canestel tree putting out wholly unexpected tiny fruit buds for a tree so young (you can almost hear its adolescent voice saying "I am SO old enough and I will if I WANT to!"); varieties of pink and red hibiscus beaming in flowers by the front door,

and the back door, and the windows, and the driveway. And did I mention there's a nest of some sort in almost every tree?

All this in my own yard. Teeming proof there's a reason this season is called "Spring." Earth rebounding. Earth coming back from the constraints of winter to her former shape in new life, before our very eyes.

And it occurs to me again, that even in the deepest Winter – with nary a bloom in sight, sap running slow, animals caving, branches bare – Earth never says, "all is lost." She only rests. She stores up energy in bud and blood and egg, the roots below digging deeper, attending the work of life, caring not that we above so often moan and groan, oblivious. No, Earth carries on despite us, readying herself for with the sweetness of fruit and beauty of flower, resilient life abounding, and rebounding.

And so can we. Listen for it ... boing.
