

If you already have a Vote-by-Mail (VBM) ballot but haven't sent it in yet and would like to vote in person instead, you can still do so. Bring your VBM ballot (blank or filled out) with you to your polling place, where poll workers can cancel it so that you can vote by regular ballot. And if you DO want to use your VBM ballot but haven't done so yet, the time is NOW! Sit down, fill it out, make sure to sign the envelope, and either mail it immediately or—better yet—drop it in a secure drop box near you to avoid possible mail delays. (The top reason mail-in ballots are rejected in Florida is because they arrive after the deadline—7 pm on Election Day.)

**From our Welcoming Congregation Team** October 26<sup>th</sup> is Intersex Awareness Day to commemorate the first intersex protest which took place in Boston. And what is intersex, you may ask? Intersex is a general term used for a variety of conditions in which a person is born with a reproductive or sexual anatomy that doesn't fit the typical definitions of female or male. Intersex



babies are always assigned a legal sex, but sometimes when they grow up, their gender doesn't match the sex selected for them. Being intersex is a naturally occurring variation in humans, and isn't a medical problem. It's more common than most people realize. Estimates suggest that about 1 in 100 people born in the U.S. is intersex.
