

Looking for Help:

Love babies? You're in luck! The River has been attracting quite a few, lately. Our new location in January will include a paid staff position for the nursery. Chalica - December 7th - 14th

Chalica begins every year on the first Monday of December and runs for 7 nights. Each night, the chalice is lit and one of our Unitarian Universalist Principles is honored. This can include chalice lighting words, a reading, discussion or journaling, a special meal, and particular actions that bring that Principle to life.

• The first night honors our first principle, where we affirm and promote the inherent worth and dignity of all people. Tonight's meal could include everyone's favorite food – no judgment, just enjoy! Take some time to let the people you love be reminded of that. Then, find some common ground with someone whose ideas challenge you.

- Night two, an orange candle can represent offering fair and kind treatment. Is there a neighbor or friend who could use a meal tonight? Maybe a waiter needs an extra tip. Decide as a family what charity could use your help. Still need to choose a child from our angel tree? Tonight's the night!
- On the third night, we light a yellow candle and seek to gain new understandings. Find a religious service online from another faith or take a virtual tour of the Vatican. Try a new food tonight perhaps from an ethnicity you haven't tried before.
- Our fourth night, our candle is lit to remind us that our spiritual growth is our responsibility. Try a new spiritual practice like yoga, or join Carolyn and Scott for meditation.
- Night five, we light a candle to affirm democracy. Take a vote for tonight's dinner, then play a game to see who can name the most elected officials.
- The sixth night is a good night for leftovers. We light our sixth candle to remind us to work for a fair and
 peaceful world. This would be a good night to visit the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee's website and
 learn about the good work that you can support.
- We light our seventh candle to show our respect for our interdependent web a good night for a vegetarian meal and stargazing! Find green ways to wrap your presents on this day dish towels, brown paper or recycled wrapping can help.
- And, finally on the eighth night, we light a candle to remind us that we still have much work to do to dismantle oppressive systems. We can add to our understanding tonight, by watching a movie that highlights ways our country has caused harm to people in the past or shares a perspective we're not familiar with.

The possibilities here are endless! However, you decide to bring Chalica to life in your home this year, I hope it provides you with a connection to your faith and a connection to each other.

World AIDS Day is observed on December 1 each year

It is a day of solidarity for people around the world who are affected by HIV. This is a day for voices to unite by sharing experiences, remembering those lost, and standing together in the fight against HIV. While great strides have been made over the four decades since the first known reported cases of AIDS, this disease remains a public



health challenge. World AIDS Day is an opportunity for every community and each individual to honor the more than 32 million people who have died worldwide from AIDS-related illness.

Each World AIDS Day focuses on a specific theme, which this year will be Equalize. UNAIDS is ßurging each of us to address the inequalities which are holding back progress in ending AIDS. This year's theme joins a growing list of challenges that World AIDS Day has alerted people to globally.

Founded in 1988, World AIDS Day was the first ever international day for global health. Every year, United Nations agencies, governments and civil society join together to campaign around specific themes related to HIV.

World AIDS Day remains as relevant today as it's always been, reminding people and governments that HIV has not gone away. There is still a critical need for increased funding for the AIDS response, to increase awareness of the impact of HIV on people's lives, to end stigma and discrimination and to improve the quality of life of people living with HIV.

Heritage and Hope

Heritage - Universalist Thomas Nast (September 26, 1840 – December 7, 1902) was German-born American caricaturist and editorial cartoonist often considered to be the "Father of the American Cartoon".

Thomas Nast produced over 70 illustrations of Santa. It is from Nast that the world first learned of Santa's red suit, that he gives coal if you're naughty, and even then Santa, as a world citizen, belonging to no single country, lives at the North Pole.

In addition, Nast's drawings were instrumental in the downfall of Boss Tweed, the powerful Tammany Hall leader. As commissioner of public works for New York City, Tweed led a ring that by 1870 had gained total control of the city's government, and controlled "a working majority in the State Legislature". Tweed and his associates defrauded the city of many millions of dollars by grossly inflating expenses paid to contractors connected to the Ring.

Tweed so feared Nast's campaign that he sent an emissary to offer the artist a bribe of \$100,000, which was represented as a gift from a group of wealthy benefactors to enable Nast to study art in Europe. Feigning interest, Nast negotiated for more before finally refusing an offer of \$500,000 with the words, "Well, I don't think I'll do it. I made up my mind not long ago to put some of those fellows behind the bars". His cartoons were probably one of the chief factors in the machine's downfall. Nast's caricature of the fleeing political boss led to Tweed's identification and arrest in Vigo, Spain, in 1876.

Our Hope - Chalica is a week-long celebration of our Unitarian Universalist Principles. The holiday first emerged in 2005 out of a wish to have a holiday organized around Unitarian Universalist values.

Chalica begins on the first Monday in December and lasts seven days. Each day, a chalice is lit and the day is spent reflecting on the meaning of that day's principle and doing a good deed that honors that principle. Not all Unitarian Universalists celebrate



Chalica, but it has a growing following. There is a <u>Chalica Facebook page</u>, <u>blog</u>, and many Chalica-themed videos on <u>YouTube</u>.

Purpose of Team: To review guidelines for congregational and smaller group gatherings in order to provide recommendations to the Board to be used for official River of Grass meetings and events.

These recommendations are:

For: only for official, River of Grass - sponsored outdoor and indoor small group gatherings.

Fluid: new information comes out all the time and the recommendations could change.

Inclusive: all attendees should be able to attend physically or virtually.

Protective: consider first those who are most at risk.

Science-based: follow the directives according to the experts.

MEETINGS IN THE TIME OF COVID

RIVER OF GRASS COVID-19 TEAM RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE BOARD: Updated October 16, 2022

This is a living document that will be regularly reviewed and updated.

COVID-19 is moving from pandemic to endemic status – it is always circulating in the community but the number of infected people varies from community to community. Individuals should take appropriate precautions based on their personal risk. River of Grass will follow the following measures for community gatherings based on CDC Guidelines and the Broward County risk levels.

Remember, you may choose to wear a mask and maintain social distancing at any time. If you have symptoms, a positive test or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, you should wear a mask.

Our COVID Team is monitoring the Broward County status weekly and will promptly advise if the status changes.

Community Level LOW: Current Broward County Status

Individuals may elect to wear masks and socially distance at all times.

Community Level MEDIUM:

- Wear face masks for indoor gatherings.
- Choir will wear singing masks.
- Unmasked speakers and the Minister must test negative with a rapid test the previous evening.

Community Level HIGH:

In person Worship Services - Inside

- Masks required for all, special requirements for speakers
- Masks should be KN-95
- Unmasked speakers and Minister must test negative with a rapid test the previous evening
- No singing except the Minister (humming OK!)

- Social distancing between family groups
- No food or drinks
- All attendees sign in

After service Hospitality - Outside

Maintain social distancing

Meetings - inside and outside

- Group leader will inquire if anyone in the group wants the meeting to be masked. If everyone is not comfortable, masking and social distancing should be maintained.
- Food and drinks determined by the group.
- All attendees sign in.
